Speculative Fiction:

This term the children will be reading 'The Water Tower' - a young adult's 1994 picture book written by Australian author Gary Crew.

Non-Fiction:

This unit will explore the layout and structure of leaflets and newspaper reports.

Poetry – The Highway Man:

Children will be analysing 'The Highway Man' by Alfred Noyse.

Maths

- Number and place value

Science

In this unit children will work towards answering the question, 'How can you make a meal from a mixture?'

Children will design a recipe and identify the types of change used throughout the menu. They will explore dissolving by seeing how many drops of water it takes to dissolve the same amount of different substances and will use the terms solute and solvent.

They will use evaporation to recover dissolved solutes and will recognise that these are reversible changes. They will also recognise that mixing and changes of state are reversible changes. Children will be introduced to examples of irreversible changes such as burning candles.
