


<p>Reading</p> 	<p>This week we are going to read another story about Mrs Armitage and compare it to the story we read earlier in the term. # Reading





## Writing

When writing your information text make sure to use some of the features you identified yesterday like titles, subtitles and bullet points. These are **highlighted in red**. You should also try and use suffixes like **-est and -er, highlighted in green** and of course **capital letters and full stops**. I'm going to write my information text about planes! For a challenge I've also included conjunctions (**and, but, so, because**).

### **Planes.**

Planes are a very new type of transport, **but** they still have a long history. **The oldest** plane was made in 1903 by the Wright brothers, **but** people were trying to invent ways to fly a long time before that!

#### **The First Planes.**

- **The first planes** only had room for the pilot and sometimes one other person.
- **The oldest** planes designed for passengers were made in the 1920s. There were normally **fewer** than 20 people on the plane.
- **Air travel** was expensive, **but** not very comfortable. It was **noisier** than travelling on a steam train. It was **colder** too, **because** there was no heating on the plane!

#### **Air Travel in the 1930s and 40s.**

- **In the 1930s** planes were **better**. They were more comfortable **and** they had Cabin Crew to help you like today.
- **In the 1940s** planes were used to fight the war, **but** also to take soldiers where they needed to go, **so** they were very important.
