<p>Reading</p> 	<p>This week we are going to read another story about Mrs Armitage and compare it to the story we read earlier in the term. Read the second half of our new story on page 2 and 3 , then answer the questions on page 4</p> <p>Don't forget to do phonics and at least 20 minutes of Reading for Pleasure (click here)!</p> <p>Today my book recommendation is: At the seaside.</p> <p>Please see the daily Ruth Miskin Training here:</p> <p>If your child is in a Red Group they should be watching the set 1 speed sound lesson and if they are in Green, Purple or Pink phonics group they should be watching the set 2 speed sound lesson. If they are in the orange, yellow, blue and grey phonics group, they should be watching the set 3 speed sound lesson.</p>

Mrs Armitage got out to look at the damage


“All this stuff,” she said “Who needs it? Let’s throw it all on the scrapheap and be on our way!”

Now, can you answer the following questions:

2. Who didn't help?
3. Who stopped to help? What was surprising about this?
4. How did they help?
