Reading answers for parents

Monday

1) What were the farmer and his wife doing that made the witch angry?

They were <u>picking</u> the fruit. (the aim is for the children to work out the meaning of the word 'pluck' from the sentence)

2) Why did the couple agree to give their first child to the witch?

They agreed because they were so scared (literal retrieval – even better if your child can expand this to explain that they never really thought she would hold them to it)

3) Why did the witch have to climb up the tower every day using Rapunzel's hair?

The tower had no door, just a window at the top.

4) Paragraph 4 – What does the word clamber mean?

Clamber means the same as climb but in a messy, struggling kind of way. (Discuss the word in other sentences – how your child clambers at the play park, or into their bunk bed)

5) Paragraph 5 and 6 – How many verbs can you find that tell you how angry the witch was? List them

Screamed, ranted, cursed and screamed (rage is a noun)

6) What does the word wounded mean?

Wounded means he was hurt. (Discuss the different pronunciation of ou grapheme – like you, youth, soup)

<u>Tuesday</u>

Reading answers – first part of the story

1) The Miller was very **boastful** – what does this mean?

He was proud of his daughter, he liked to show off, he exaggerated and said things that weren't completely true.

2) Use the word **boastful** in your own sentence.

I don't want to sound boastful but I always finish everything on time.

The hare was boastful and challenge the tortoise to a race

3) Why did the Miller tell the king that his daughter could spin straw into gold if it wasn't true?

Pick up on this phrase - in order to make himself seem important.

The miller was poor, he didn't have much so he exaggerated to try and impress the king

4) How did the Miller's daughter feel when she first put into the room full of straw?

Any answer referring to her feeling worried, sad, helpless, lost, overwhelmed.

Possibly also angry with her father.

5) Who came to help her?

A strange little man, a dwarf. (He was a peculiar, little man – one of our earlier vocabulary words!)

6) What 3 things did she give/promise him as a reward for spinning the straw?

A necklace, a ring and her first baby

<u>Wednesday</u>

Reading questions – second part of the story

1) Why was her promise foolish?

It was foolish because you should never make a promise that you aren't prepared to keep.

2) What did the Queen offer the Dwarf instead of her baby?

He offered her all the riches of the kingdom. (Even better if they can explain this means lots of gold and jewels, everything that the king owns)

3) Why did he not accept?

The dwarf said that he wanted something human. (I think that means he was lonely and wanted a child for company)

4) Write 3 names that the Queen guessed but they were incorrect.

Any 3 from - Caspar, Melchior, Balthasar, Ribs-of-Beef, Sheep-shank, Whalebone, Conrad. Hal

5) Where did the messenger eventually find the Dwarf?

He found him on a high mountain near the edge of a forest.

6) What was the dwarf doing when the messenger saw him?

The dwarf was dancing around a fire in front of a little house.

7) Draw a picture of the scene that is described by the messenger.
