


<p>Tuesday 12th May 2020</p> <p>Home Learning – Year 1 - Week 4 – Tuesday</p> <p><i>Hello from Miss Jarrell, Miss Williams and Mrs Meek</i></p>	
<p>Reading</p> 	<p>This week we are going to be reading poetry that rhymes. With an adult, sibling or another child, read the poem on page 2. Which words rhyme? Here is an example of two words that rhyme: ‘cow’ and ‘now’. Here is another example from the poem this time: ‘high’ and ‘fly’. If they are in the Orange phonics group, they should be watching the set 3 speed sound lesson.</p>
<p>Writing</p> 	<p>Yesterday, we continued writing our story. Today we’re going to carry on writing it and check it. Make sure to use your story plan from Wednesday to help you. Remember to include all our steps to success: capital letters, full stops, finger spaces, adjectives (big, small, amazing, scary), suffixes (-est -er) and conjunctions (And, but, because, so).</p> <p>Spellings- Please ask an adult or older sibling to test you on your spellings today.</p> <p>Our words this week are: voice, choice, void, noise, coin</p>



Writing

Do you go through a tunnel or past a special place?

A deep and dark tunnel



This is the fifth section of my plan and now I am going to use them to write the next section of my story – remembering to use my capital letters, full stops, conjunctions to join my sentences together and using the adjectives I have written in my plan.

Remember to read the sections you wrote this week and last week back to yourself.

You can use this model write to help you:

RE – Christianity

Sometimes Jesus told parables to people. A parable is an easy-to-understand story that helps people understand something that is very hard to understand. Jesus told a parable about two men who each decided to build their own houses. The two men went out looking for the perfect place to build the house.

The first man was very wise and thought carefully before building his house.

“I will find a place that is flat and hard to build my house, so that it will never fall down!” He said. He searched for a long time until finally he found a large open space made of rock. It was perfect! He built his house on the rock, feeling confident that it would be strong and safe.

The wise man lived in his house for a long time. Lots of storms came and winds blew against his house, but it didn't fall down because it was built on the strong and stable rock!

The second man was impatient and not very wise. He wanted his house now! He bought the first piece of land he saw and just started building, not bothering to check if the ground was strong and stable. He didn't even notice that he had built his house on a pile of sand! His house kept slipping and sliding but the second man didn't care!

“The quicker I build this, the quicker I'll be able to shelter inside.” He said.

When the second man finished his house, he moved in. Guess what happened when the first storm came? The winds blew, and the rains came down and the second man's house fell apart. It fell apart because it did not have a strong foundation.
